Happy New Year! We are now close to half way into the first month of 2019. Some have experienced bitter cold and snow while others have had sunshine and nice weather. Many of us have thoughts of spring and our Mid-Winter Meeting which is just around the corner.

If you have not made your reservations, please do so as soon as possible. You can call directly to the Cool Springs Marriott at **(615) 261 6134** to make your reservations. We have a fantastic line-up of speakers that should have something to appeal to all roses growers. **Carol Shockley**, who is a national level exhibitor, will give a presentation on new roses. Our own **Dr. Mark Windham**, nationally recognized authority for his work on Rose Rosette Disease will present a fact-filled and humorous update on the dreaded rose disease. **Paul Colombo**, nationally acclaimed photographer and an outstanding horticultural judge will give an entertaining presentation on Photography. **Dr. Satish Prabhu**, the top National Exhibitor in the country, will give a presentation on transporting roses to rose shows including flying with them. **Sandy Dixon**, a national level arranger who has won on the national level multiple times, will give a presentation on Arrangements. **Richard J. Anthony**, who has 26 registered roses to date with several more on the way, will give a presentation on hybridizing roses. Last but not least, **Monica Pape**, of the Accidental Agronomist, will give a program on understanding amendments and fertilizers.

In addition, we have vendors who will have products and plants for sale. Tina Jennings, from **Remarkable Roses**, will have several potted OGR's and shrub roses for sale. Brenna Bosch, of **For Love of Roses** will have several potted miniature and miniflora roses for sale and Clayton Beaty of **Beaty Fertilizer** will bring several of his products for us to purchase.

Also, we will have over 200 donated roses for sale. We have potted up the roses from **Weeks Roses** and will soon do so with the **David Austin** roses. The remainder of the donated roses will be bare root from **Certified Roses**. They are shipping the Monday of the week of the Tenarky Mid-Winter Meeting and will be soaked in water from Wednesday afternoon until we bag them to transport to Franklin, TN. We will also have 20 potted miniature and miniflora roses from **For Love of Roses** that are either newly registered or soon to be registered roses in the silent auction. This is our only fund raiser each year and obviously we need the roses to be purchased. Without the generosity of Certified, David Austin, For Love of Roses and Weeks, we would not be able to bring in top-level speakers or to meet our obligation to the ARS. IDEAS USING ROSES AND OTHER PLANTS

For a small garden choose a climbing rose and then both low growing and tall roses. Add companion plants for accent and to prolong the flowering season.

Combine roses in colors. Pink and white paired with blue plants. Red and white, yellow and orange are two other combinations, all paired with lavender, catnip and other herbs like sage, thyme, southern wormwood and hyssop.

Be mindful of planting bulbs with roses such as tulips and lilies making sure to direct water away from the bulbs.

Other perennials that bloom well with roses are yarrow, columbine, clematis, lady's mantle, Shasta daisies, summer phlox, larkspur/delphiniums and day lilies.

Use your imagination and don't be afraid to step outside the box.
