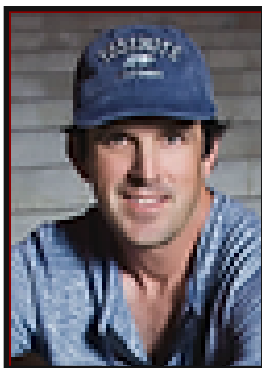

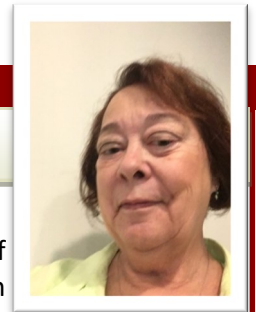


Carol Shockley

Hybridizer Dave Bang will join us virtually to discuss his hybridizing process and his roses.

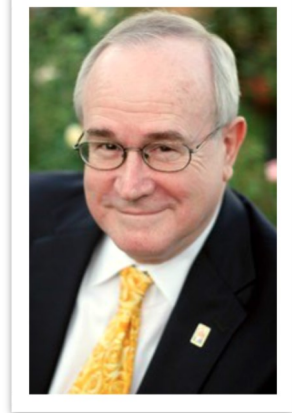


In Remembrance . . .

Robert B. Martin, Jr.

July 14, 1944– November 26, 2021

Bob Martin, Immediate Past President of the American Rose Society, a friend to many of our members and a giant among rosarians, passed away suddenly Friday, November 26, 2021 at his home in Escondido, California. Bob served as President of the American Rose Society from 2018 to 2021. He was a Master Rosarian, an Accredited Horticultural Judge, and an Accredited Arrangements Judge. Bob was an active rose exhibitor and educator and was the 2006 recipient of the ARS Guy Blake Hedrick, Jr. Award for lifetime achievement in rose exhibiting and the 2009 recipient of the ARS Klima Medal for his lifetime contribution to rose education. He was a prolific writer, having written more than 700 articles on roses; was the editor of *Horizon Roses*, an annual review of the top exhibition roses; and was the author of the book, *Showing Good Roses*. His most recent achievement in education was co-editing the 2021 American Rose Annual. Another of his talents was hybridizing, including the creation of 'Butter Cream', 'Peter Cotton-tail', 'Dona Martin', and 'Pasadena Star' among others.



Bob came to the Tenarky Winter Workshop several times over the years always presenting excellent programs and sharing his experiences with growing roses. He was an expert on every phase and eager to share his knowledge with all of us. He will be greatly missed. Our deep condolences to his wife, Dona, his family, and many friends. “Antique Roses for Modern Gardens”



Connie Hilker

Connie Hilker is a lifelong gardener with more than 400 varieties of roses in her personal collection. She manages the documentation, preservation, and restoration of the historic rose collection at Hollywood Cemetery in Richmond, Virginia, and is the rose consultant at the Thomas Jefferson Center for Historic Plants at Monticello. She is the Old Garden Rose chair for the American Rose Society Colonial District, historian of the Richmond Rose Society, a member of the Board of Trustees of the Heritage Rose Foundation, and author of *Heritage Roses: A Collection of Essays and Lessons*.

Connie can often be found collecting rose cuttings from cemeteries and old home sites; teaching classes on rose history, care, and propagation; or tending to the roses in her garden with her husband Steve at their historic home in Hartwood, Virginia. Connie’s overall message is that “roses are not rocket science” and she strives to show that anyone with a basic knowledge of gardening can choose appropriate roses and grow them well.

Gaye Hammond is the Past President of the Houston Rose Society, the largest local rose society in the United States, and has served on their Board of Directors for almost 20 years. She is also a Life Member and Steward of American Rose Society and has chaired several committees of the national organization. Gaye was the guest editor of the 2017 *American Rose Annual*, a Special Section Editor of the *American Rose* magazine, and is a member of the Garden Writers Association.

She has co-authored a peer-reviewed journal article on Earth-Kind Roses published in 2009 in the textbook, *Floriculture & Ornamental Biotechnology*, a chapter in *The Sustainable Rose Garden* and authored a chapter on rose horticulture in the book, *Gulf Coast Gardening*. Her photography has appeared on the cover of *HortScience* (December 2010) and she was awarded the cover story for the September 2011 issue of *Parks & Recreation Magazine*. She has more than 300 published articles.

Since 2000 Gaye has been part of the Earth-Kind Rose Research team - a partnership between the Houston Rose Society and Texas AgriLife Extension (part of the Texas A&M University System) that scientifically studies roses and other plants for their hardiness and resistance to pests and diseases to various geographic regions in the United States and abroad..

“Rose Rosette Update”



Dr. Mark Windham

Dr. Mark Windham is a professor in the Agriculture Department at University of Tennessee - Knoxville and Distinguished Chair of Ornamental Pathology. Currently, the majority of his research is focused on Rose Rosette Disease (RRD), the most destructive ornamental disease in the U.S. However, Dr. Windham is also involved in research on plant health issues with hydrangea, flowering dogwood, and roses.

He is one of the leading experts and researchers on Rose Rosette virus and has written numerous articles on his research findings concerning the RRD and is a frequent speaker at local, district, and national rose society meetings and conventions. He is a much sought-after speaker who not only inspires and educates his students and rosarians; but he has been a presenter at nearly every Tenarky District Winter Workshop for the past 20 years.

Beyond the lab, Dr. Windham loves spending time with his family, reading books, and walking along the beach. Every month, he and his wife adventure somewhere new with nothing but a compass as their guide. His character, professionalism, and outlook on life can only be described as reMARKable!



Progress! We have resistance to Rose Rosette Disease! by Dr. Mark Windham, Professor and Distinguished Chair, University of Tennessee

Just a short while ago, the standard line for resistance to rose rosette disease was that resistance to rose rosetted resistance was unknown. We can now put that statement to bed! Through efforts by Dave Byrne, Oscar Riera-Lizarazu, and Brent Pember-ton (*Texas A&M University*), Mark Windham, Frank Hale. and Alan Windham (*University of Tennessee*) and Tom Evans (*University of Delaware*) and the support of organizations such as the *American Rose Garden Selections (ARGS)*, the *Heritage Rose Foundation*, and the *Research Trust of the American Rose Society* and private donors like you, resistance has been identified in ten *Rosa* species, five *Rugosa* hybrids, six rose cultivars and five rose breeding lines. These results took many years of exhaustive research involving thousands of hours of data collection, plant maintenance, virus screenings and data analyses.

However, now is not the time to rest on our laurels. Instead, it is urgent that we refocus our work toward getting rose rosette resistance genes into roses needed by the rose industry and for rosarians' gardens. Imagine a rose garden where rosarians can once again work toward reaching the maximum potential of hybrid teas, floribundas, grandifloras, climbers, miniatures, etc. without having to scout for rose rosette disease and destroying valued roses that are symptomatic for the disease. No longer would private and public gardens fear the destruction of their roses! This future is now possible, but to accomplish this goal, we must have your support.

Currently, *Texas A&M* is producing thousands of cuttings of seedlings for testing by the *University of Tennessee* for resistance to rose rosette disease. These seedlings are crosses between susceptible roses with the superior rose characteristics that rosarians crave and plants with rose rosette resistance. Seedlings will be tested for field resistance to rose rosette virus in research plots at the *UT Plateau and Research Center* near Crossville TN, and duplicate seedlings will be evaluated in Texas for resistance to foliar diseases such as black spot and cercospora leaf spot and for desirable horticultural traits. This project will be headed by Drs. Dave Byrne and Mark Windham (Fig. 3) and will be also supported by the work of other scientists such as Dr. Oscar Riera-Lizarazu who will be responsible for genetic analysis of field data.

We need your help if we are to achieve our goal of reducing the impact of rose rosette disease on roses you want for your garden. A donation for supporting our research will be directed at producing disease resistant roses. We are committing our time and resources toward this goal, but we cannot be successful without your support. We hope that you will partner with us in this project where the goal is the production of rose rosette resistant roses that you will enjoy growing in your garden for many years to come.
