2019 ARS Miniature National Conference & Rose Show Franklin, TN – October 5, 2019

The grooming area will open at **1:00 AM**. Exhibitors will place their own entries from **6:00 AM** until **9:30 AM** being careful not to touch or move another entry. Rose Show personnel will be available to assist exhibitors as needed. Challenge Class Entries will be assigned space by a lottery drawing. Challenge Class Entries are not to be touched by anyone except the entrant.

Cash Prizes, Trophies, Certificates and Ribbons (if desired) may be picked up Saturday, October 5, 2019 at **4:00 PM** in the hallway in front of the rose show. Prizes and Certificates for the Nine (9) National Challenge Class winners and Miniature, Miniflora, Polyantha Queens and District Queens will be presented at the Awards Banquet Saturday evening.

RULES

1. ARS National Challenge Classes are open to **all** exhibitors who are **ARS members** and who are **registered** for this convention. All other Miniature National Classes are open to all exhibitors who are **registered** for this convention.
2. Entries are judged by ARS accredited and/or ARS apprentice judges according to ARS Guidelines and Rules for Judging Roses and other show conditions as set forth in this Rose Show Schedule. Only Blue Ribbon Winners are eligible for Awards and/or Prizes. The point scale at the bottom of the Rose Show Rules will be incorporated into the judging of the roses in accordance to ARS Rules and Regulations. Particular attention should be paid to reasons for disqualification (DQ) as listed in these guidelines and below.
3. Entries are to be placed from **6:00 am until 9:30 AM** on October 5, 2019. Only one exhibitor or team per garden is permitted and rose(s) **MUST** be out door grown. Judging will commence promptly at **9:45 AM** and is anticipated to conclude at approximately **12:30 PM** (or earlier) at which time the rose show will be open to the general public. The decision(s) of the judges is final. The Rose Show Committee will furnish all containers except as specifically noted in the Rose Show Schedule. Each entry must be accompanied by a securely folded ARS Entry Tag(s) completed with Section, Class, Variety and Exhibitor Name(s), address and Convention (Exhibitor) Registration Number. **Both top and Bottom** portions of the ARS Entry Tag need be completed. Only Pencil, Blue or Black ink, Stamp with Blue or Black ink or Printed Black Name Labels may be used.
4. Wedging of **green floral foam** only is permitted; however, an entry may be penalized if the wedging extends above the lip of the vase according to the degree of distraction.

5. With the exception of Seedlings and Sports, rose varieties exhibited must be entered under the approved exhibition name adopted by the American Rose Society as listed in any one of the following official ARS publications: Modern Roses 12 (Book and Data Base), The Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Judges and Exhibitors, The Handbook for Selecting Roses, or Recent Registrations on the ARS web site. In instances where a variety is not listed in any of the above listed ARS publications, a listing in the **2019 Combined Rose List** (CRL) is acceptable.
6. With the exception of Challenge Classes and classes specifying multiple varieties, all roses in each class will be placed alphabetically and each variety in each class shall constitute a separate class to be judged separately. During judging, only the Rose Show Committee, Judges and Clerks will be permitted in the Rose Show Area.
7. With the exception of Seedling and Sports, all entries become the property of the Tipton County Rose Friends and will either be sold off at the conclusion of the Rose Show or donated to local hospitals and nursing homes.
8. ARS Certificates, TCRF Certificates and Cash Prizes will be awarded as set forth in the Rose Show Schedule.

Reasons for Disqualification

- a. Mis-named, Mis-classed, Mis-placed by the exhibitor, Unlabeled, Partially labeled or Mislabeled,
- b. Stem on Stem which is a specimen exhibited with a portion of the previous stem growth attached. Exception: Old Garden Roses and Shrub roses may be shown Stem on Stem but, only with **one** dog leg.
- c. Presence of foreign substance applied to the foliage, stem or bloom to improve the appearance of the specimen.
- d. Not disbudded. Any class calling for a one-bloom per stem specimen must be exhibited without side buds. A side bud is defined as growth emanating from a leaf axil and having sufficient maturity to display the formation of a stem with or without flower buds. The presence of one or more leaves at the leaf axil with no evidence of a stem is cause for penalization according to the degree of distraction but, not disqualification. Exception: Species, Old Garden Roses, Climbers and Shrub one bloom per stem specimens may be exhibited with side buds.
- e. An entry in violation of ARS rules or specific rules applying to this rose show.
- f. Any rose that has been entered in this show with a name that has not been recognized by the American Rose Society will be disqualified. Roses are to be exhibited with the recognized ARS exhibition name (AEN).

2019 ARS Miniature National Convention & Rose Show

Horticultural Rose Show Schedule October 5, 2019

Section HA National Challenge Classes

Classes 1 - 9 are open only to current members of the American Rose Society who are registered for this convention. Space for Classes 1 through and including Class 11 will be assigned by lottery drawing.

Class 1. Ralph S Moore National Award

Nine (9) miniature roses, each a different variety, exhibited in separate containers. All being at exhibition stage. The exhibit should not exceed 18 inches in any horizontal direction.

Class 2. Frank A. Benardella Memorial Miniature Challenge Trophy

An entry of seven (7) one bloom per stem miniature blooms of varieties that display exhibition form, exhibited at exhibition stage, each a different variety, staged in separate containers with individual entry tags. [Width of entry allowed: 18 inches]

Class 3. F. Harmon Saville Memorial Challenge Bowl

An entry of eighteen (18) exhibition type miniature roses, six (6) or more varieties, displayed in a low bowl. Container to be provided by the exhibitor and should not exceed four (4) inches in diameter. Floral foam is permitted. [Width of entry allowed: 18 inches]

Class 4. Dee Bennett Memorial Trophy

An entry of twelve (12) miniature roses, at exhibition stage, without side buds. One variety or any combination of varieties, displayed in a clear container provided by the exhibitor. The exhibitor may use floral foam for support. [Width of entry allowed: 18 inches]

Class 5. Jan Shivers National Miniature Trophy

An entry of seven (7) one-bloom-per-stem miniature varieties of "Award of Excellence" winners, each being a different variety, exhibited in separate containers. [Width of entry allowed:18 inches]

Class 6. J. Benjamin Williams Miniflora Rose National Trophy

An entry of ten (10) miniflora roses, either one (1) each of ten (10) different varieties or two (2) each of five (5) different varieties; one bloom per stem, each exhibited in separate containers, all blooms at exhibition stage and each bloom having a separate entry tag. [Width of entry allowed:18 Inches]

Class 7. Top Gun Award

An entry of nine (9) one bloom per stem miniflora blooms exhibited at exhibition stage, each a different variety, to be staged in separate vases with individual entry tags. [Width of entry allowed: 18 inches]

Class 8. Rose Hybridizers Association Trophy

An entry of one (1) Miniature or Miniflora seedling (not a sport) bred by an amateur, to be judged according to the standards for seedling and sports as outlined in the *Guidelines and Rules for Judging Roses*. [Width of entry allowed: 18 Inches]

Class 9. Fred Edmunds, Sr. Memorial ARS Youth Award

An entry of three (3) specimens, each specimen of which may be a bloom at any stage or a spray, any classification or classifications, each of a different variety, exhibited in separate containers. Roses must be grown and exhibited by an exhibitor between Ten (10) and Eighteen (18) years of age at any time during the calendar year in which the show is held. [Width of entry allowed: 18 Inches]

Section HB Special Challenge Classes

Class 10. Sandy & Bob Lunderg Miniflora Challenge

An entry of six (6) one bloom per stem miniflora blooms of varieties that display exhibition form, exhibited at exhibition stage, either each of the same variety or Three (3) different varieties of two (2) each, staged in separate containers with individual entry tags. [Width of entry allowed:18"]

Class 11. Basket Challenge

An entry of not less than eighteen (18) or more than thirty six (36) miniature or miniflora blooms exhibited at exhibition stage, without side buds. Any combination of varieties exhibited in a basket supplied by the exhibitor. Floral foam is permitted. [Width of entry allowed: 18 inches]

Section HC Challenge Classes

Class 12. Award of Excellence (AOE) Winners

Five (5) blooms of AOE winners, either all miniature or all minifloras, each a different variety, at exhibition stage, without side buds, exhibited in separate vases with an individual entry tag for each variety. [Width allowed: 18 inches] List of AOE winners is located on page 13.

Class 13. Hall of Fame (HOF) Winners

Five (5) blooms of Hall of Fame winners, each a different variety at exhibition stage without side buds. Exhibited in separate vases with individual entry tags for each variety. [Width allowed: 18 inches] List of Hall of Fame winners is located on page 14.

Class 14. Hi – Lo

One (1) bloom per stem **Miniflora** rose and **One (1)** bloom per stem **Miniature** rose at exhibition stage and matched as closely as possible for Form, Color, Degree of Opening and Balance and Proportion, shown in separate containers with separate entry tags.

Class 15. Matched Pair

Two (2) one bloom per stem blooms of the same Miniature or Miniflora roses, each at exhibition stage and matched as closely as possible for Form, Color, Degree of Opening and Balance and Proportion and exhibited in separate vases with separate entry tags.

Class 16. Miniature Exhibition Bloom & Spray

One (1) bloom per stem and one (1) spray of the same variety exhibited in separate vases with separate entry tags.

Class 17. Miniature Vase Collection (3)

A collection of three (3) roses either the same or different varieties at exhibition stage and exhibited in one container.

Class 18. Miniature Vase (5) Same Hybridizer

A collection of five (5) roses either same or different at exhibition stage hybridized by the **same hybridizer** exhibited in one container.

Class 19. Miniature Cycle of Bloom

Three (3) Miniature rose blooms of the **same variety** representative of the three distinct stages of development. One bloom should be approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ open just beginning to unfurl with sepals down, one bloom should be at exhibition stage $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ open and one bloom should be fully open with stamens showing, exhibited in separate containers with separate entry tags.

Class 20. Miniature Rose Bowl

One (1) Miniature rose without foliage, at exhibition stage, exhibited in clear water in a bowl furnished by the rose show committee.

Class 21. Miniature Palette – Exhibition Bloom

Five (5) Miniature roses at exhibition stage each a **different** variety, representative of colors used by an artist. **Exhibitors may use their own palette.**

Class 22. Miniature Palette – Open Bloom

Five (5) Miniature roses at open bloom stage with stamens showing, each a **different** variety, representative of colors used by an artist. **Exhibitors may use their own palette.**

Class 23. Miniature English Box

Six (6) Miniature roses without foliage, of the same variety, at exhibition stage. **Exhibitors may use their own English Boxes**

Class 24. Miniature American Box

Nine (9) Miniature roses without foliage, of the same variety or any combination of different varieties, at exhibition stage. **Exhibitors may use their own American Boxes. Two English Boxes may be used for this entry.**

Class 25. Miniature Picture Frame

One (1) Miniature bloom at exhibition stage exhibited in an 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 11 picture frame. **Exhibitors may use their own picture frames.**

Class 26. Miniflora Vase Collection (3)

A collection of three (3) Miniflora roses either the same or different at exhibition stage exhibited in one container.

Class 27. Miniflora Vase (5) Same Hybridizer

A collection of five (5) Miniflora roses either same or different at exhibition stage hybridized by the **same hybridizer** exhibited in one container.

Class 28. Miniflora Cycle of Bloom

Three (3) Miniflora rose blooms of the **same variety** representative of the three distinct stages of development. One bloom should be approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ open just beginning to unfurl with sepals down, one bloom should be at exhibition stage $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ open and one bloom should be fully open with stamens showing, exhibited in separate containers with separate entry tags

Class 29. Miniflora Rose Bowl

One (1) Miniflora rose without foliage, at exhibition stage, exhibited in clear water in a bowl furnished by the show committee.

Class 30. Miniflora Palette – Exhibition Bloom

Five (5) Miniflora roses at exhibition stage, each a **different** variety, representative of colors used by an artist. **Exhibitors may use their own palette.**

Class 31. Miniflora Palette – Open Bloom

Five (5) Miniflora roses at open bloom stage with stamens showing, each a **different** variety, representative of colors used by an artist. **Exhibitors may use their own palette.**

Class 32. Miniflora English Box

Six (6) Miniflora roses without foliage, of the same variety, at exhibition stage. **Exhibitors may use their own English Boxes**

Class 33. Miniflora American Box

Nine (9) Miniflora roses without foliage, of the same variety or any combination of different varieties, at exhibition stage. **Exhibitors may use their own American Boxes. Two English Boxes may be used for this entry.**

Class 34. Miniflora Picture Frame

One (1) Miniflora bloom at exhibition stage exhibited in an 8 ½ x 11 picture frame. **Exhibitors may use their own picture frames.**

Class 35. Miniature and or Miniflora Collection – Country Music Theme

A collection of five (5) roses same or different with a Country Music Theme in the **Name** of the rose at exhibition stage exhibited in separate vases with separate entry tags. Refer to Page 15 for a representative list of Country Music rose names.

Class 36. Miniature or Miniflora Rose Bowl

Nine (9) or more Miniature or Miniflora roses without foliage, at exhibition stage, exhibited in clear water in a bowl furnished by the exhibitor.

Class 37. Miniature or Miniflora Left over Lovelies

A collection of not less than nine (9) or more than twenty (20) Miniature or Miniflora roses exhibited in one container provided by the exhibitor.

Class 38. Polyantha Spray Collection

A collection of **five (5)** Polyantha Sprays each a different variety shown in separate containers with separate entry tags

Class 39. Polyantha Spray Collection

A collection of **three (3)** Polyantha sprays, same or different exhibited in a vase provided by the show committee.

Section HD Miniature Horticultural Specimens

Class 40. Miniature Exhibition Bloom

One (1) Miniature bloom at exhibition stage. The best seven (7) blue ribbon winning roses are eligible for **Queen, King, Princess and court.**

Class 41. Miniature Open Bloom

One (1) Miniature Bloom of a fully open bloom with sepals down and stamens showing.

Class 42. Miniature Spray

One (1) Miniature spray with two (2) or more blooms.

Class 43. Miniature Single

One (1) Miniature bloom classified as a single with four (4) to eight (8) petals and/or classified as a single in an ARS publication or the 2019 CRL.

Section HE Miniflora Horticultural Specimens

Class 44. Miniflora Exhibition Bloom

One (1) Miniflora bloom at exhibition stage. The best seven (7) blue ribbon winning roses are eligible for **Queen, King, Princess and court.**

Class 45. Miniflora Open Bloom

One (1) Miniflora Bloom of a fully open bloom with sepals down and stamens showing.

Class 46. Miniflora Spray

One (1) Miniflora spray with two (2) or more blooms.

Class 47. Miniflora Single

One (1) Miniflora bloom classified as a single with four (4) to eight (8) petals and/or classified as a single in an ARS publication or the 2019 CRL.

Section HF Novice Class

Open to exhibitors that are **registered** for the Convention and Rose Show that have **NEVER** won a blue ribbon in the horticulture section of an ARS National, Miniature National, District or Local Rose Show. Number of entries per exhibitor is **not** limited. Novice exhibitors may also exhibit in any other classes for which they are eligible. Blue ribbon winners in each class will compete for the appropriate Court of Honor awards in Sections HD & HE.

Class 48. Miniature Exhibition Bloom

One (1) Miniature bloom at exhibition stage.

Class 49. Miniature Spray

One (1) Miniature spray with two (2) or more blooms.

Class 50. Miniflora Exhibition Bloom

One (1) Miniflora bloom at exhibition stage.

Class 51. Miniflora Spray

One (1) Miniflora spray with two (2) or more blooms.

Section HG Polyantha Horticultural Specimens

Class 52. Polyantha Spray

One (1) Polyantha Spray at exhibition stage. The best seven (7) blue ribbon winning roses are eligible for **Queen, King, Princess and court.**

Section HH Judges Classes

Open to Judges and Apprentice Judges who are judging in the Horticulture Section of this rose show. Limited to three (3) entries per exhibitor per class. ARS Judges Certificate will be awarded to the best blue ribbon entry in each class.

Class 53. Miniature Exhibition Bloom

One (1) Miniature bloom at exhibition stage.

Class 54. Miniature Spray

One (1) Miniature spray with two (2) or more blooms.

Class 55. Miniflora Exhibition Bloom

One (1) Miniflora bloom at exhibition stage

Class 56. Miniflora Spray

One (1) Miniflora spray with two (2) or more blooms.

Section HI Best of Show

Class 57. Best of Show

To be selected from all of the winning entries on the honors table. Nine (9) judges will vote for the Best of Show trophy. Five votes out of nine are necessary to win Best of Show. TCRF Certificate & Cash Prize
